

Welcome to Parsons Green



The name is derived from the parsonage or rectory that used to stand about midway along the western side of the Green. The rectory was demolished in 1882, and St. Dionis Church built on the site. The Green was formerly a portion of the Manor of Fulham.

References to Parsons Green date back to at least the 14th century. A pond known in the 17th century as Colepitts was situated at the south east corner of the Green. It was filled in during the 19th century when the natural spring by was destroyed during the construction of the main drainage of King's (later New King's) Road. In 1878 a granite drinking fountain was erected by the Rev, R.G. Baker on the south side of the Green facing New King's Road.

Parsons Green, together with Eelbrook Common and Brook Green, was purchased by the Metropolitan Board of Works for £5,000 in 1881 and administered as a public open space.

The administration and maintenance of Parsons Green was transferred to the London Borough of Hammersmith in April 1971.

Welcome to Upper Mall



In April 1969, the council began negotiation with the Metropolitan Water Board to purchase surplus land from the Water Board. This land comprise of an area fronting the river between Hammersmith Terrace and the Old Ship Public House.

The Council agreed that the surplus land from the Water Board should be laid out as an open space. The development of the open spaces required the re-alignment of the existing right of way through this site. The resulting open space, Upper Mall, was opened on 22 October 1970 by Sir Alan Robert.
