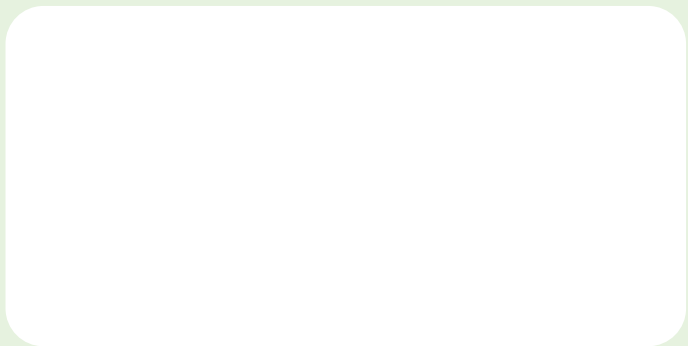

Voter registration form

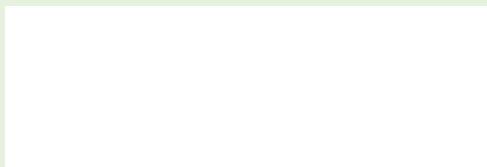


Now is the time for all households in the UK to register.

By law, you have to register every year.

Not registering, or giving false information, can lead to a £1,000 fine.

- If you have registered in the last few months you still have to confirm your details
- If you are a citizen of one of the countries listed over the page - AND you live at this address - your name has to be on the voters list.
- If you are not eligible to register, you have to tell us why in part 4.
- Reply by:
to avoid a reminder, or a canvasser calling.
- You can change your opt-out choice on the phone or internet but NOT by text.

Who has to register to vote?

Residence

People can register **only** for the address **where they are living**. If you change your address you can now re-register as soon as you move.

Nationality/citizenship

Only British, Commonwealth, Irish and European Union citizens are allowed to vote. If you are a citizen of one of these countries, you have to register.

Jury service

People over 70 are not called for jury service. People who cannot serve for other reasons can say so if they get a jury summons.

Second homes

People who live at two homes are allowed to register at both, but can only vote once at the same election. For more advice ring the helpline.

Anonymous registration

If your personal safety would be at risk from your name appearing in the Voters List, you may be able to register anonymously.

The rules are very strict.

The two versions of the voters list - "opt out" explained

The electoral registration officer makes and keeps two versions of the voters list - a full version and an edited version.

The full voters list

The full voters list lists the name and address of everyone who is registered to vote. The council holds a copy. Anyone can look at it, but it is a criminal offence to supply or use copies for purposes other than those set down in law. More information is available at www.aboutmyvote.co.uk

The main use of the full register is to show who can vote in elections and referendums. Credit reference agencies can use it, but only to check your name and address if you are applying for

credit and for other purposes specified in law. It can also be used for law enforcement.

The edited voters list

The edited list is available for general sale and can be used for any purpose. The edited register can be bought by any person, company or organisation and be used for commercial activities such as marketing.

If you do not want your details sold from the edited list, you must tell us. Either tick the 'opt out' box, or if you register by phone or online, please follow the instructions given. Please ask other household members if they want to be on the edited list or not. If you have already 'opted out', this is shown over the page. You can change this, if you wish.

Voting by post or proxy

If you have already arranged to vote by post or proxy this will be shown alongside your name. If this is not shown and you would like to vote by post or proxy, please tick the box and we will send you an application form. Or you can get a form now from the website www.lbhf.gov.uk/electoralservices
