Dear Resident,

Re: Advance Notification of potential football club victory parade – 16 May 2010

Chelsea Football Club has approached Hammersmith & Fulham Council and the Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea to discuss the possibility of holding a victory parade on the streets of Chelsea and Fulham should they win the Premier League.

You will appreciate that the club are entitled to use the highway but the two affected local councils have to decide how to react to the inevitable crowd interest. We believe that the responsible thing to do is to recognise the wish for local residents and fans from further afield, to celebrate and put in place plans – alongside the police and emergency services – to ensure the large crowds expected do not present a public safety risk.

If Chelsea are successful, a parade will take place on Sunday 16 May 2010 – the day after the FA Cup Final at Wembley – between 13.00 and 14.00. The parade would start from Stamford Bridge's west entrance and will then travel east along Fulham Road before turning right onto Hortensia Road, right again onto Kings Road and then on to New Kings Road. The procession will end at Parsons Green.

It is anticipated that many people will want to view the parade and for public safety reasons, the roads list on the back of this letter will be restricted and closed to through vehicle traffic on Sunday until the crowds disperse:

There will be no parking in Hortensia Road. The inevitable consequence of this plan is that we have to advise you that any vehicles parked on Hortensia Road on Sunday morning may be removed by our contractors. We recognise this will inconvenience some residents but on advice from the police we feel this is a necessary imposition, given available parade route options. The removal of barriers and clean up operation on all routes affected by the parade will start as soon as crowd conditions allow.

For all business premises please consider the safety of your staff and customers during this major crowd event, particularly if your premises has frontage overlooking the parade route.

Chelsea Football Club is currently preparing detailed event plans for approval by Hammersmith & Fulham Council, the Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea and the emergency services. More detailed information will be available on the Club's website, www.chelseafc.com, from 10 May.
