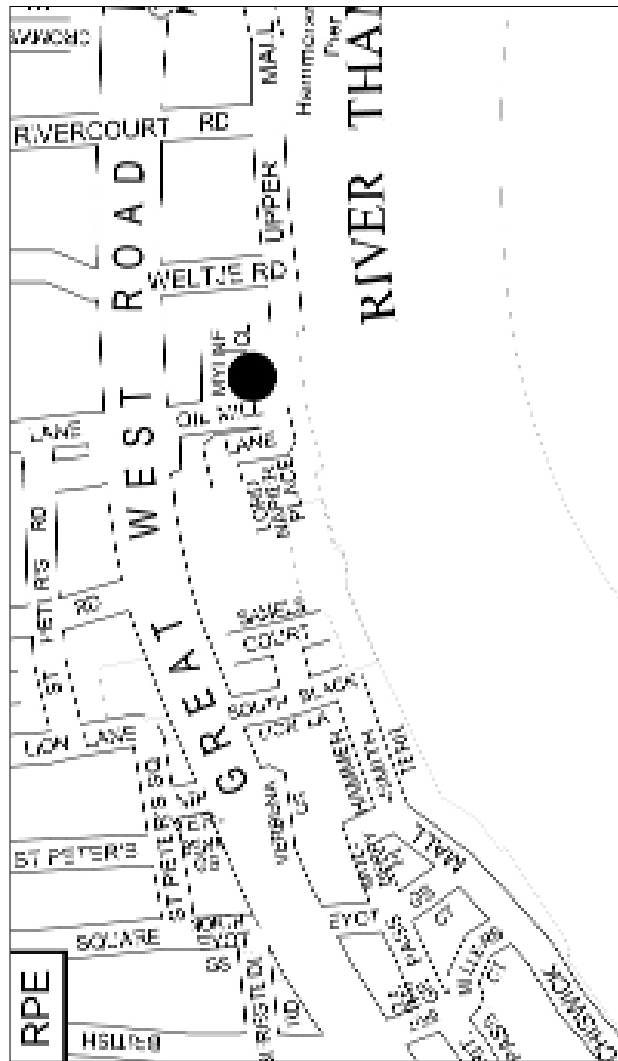

Poll cards are sent to everyone who is included on the Voters List, even though they may have moved since the list was drawn up. The Voters List for this election is now closed.

This card is for information only. It helps the polling staff if you take it with you when you go to the polling station. However, you do not need the card to vote as long as you are on the voters list.

- When you go to the polling station, please tell the staff your name and address, as shown on the front of the card. You are asked to do this to make sure the wrong name is not crossed off the list.
- The staff will confirm your entry on the register
- When you are given your ballot papers, go (on your own) to one of the voting booths.

- In the London Mayoral election (pink ballot paper) vote once (X) in column one for your first choice, vote once (X) in column two for your second choice.
- In the Constituency member election (yellow ballot paper), vote once (X) in one blank box.
- In the London members election (peach ballot paper), vote once (X) in one blank box.
- DO NOT FOLD the ballot papers. Show the staff the number and other unique identifying mark on the back, but do not let anyone see your vote. Put your ballot papers in the ballot box and leave the polling station.
- If by mistake you spoil your ballot paper, show it to the polling staff and ask for another one.
- **If you have a postal vote at this election, you will not be entitled to vote in person, so please ignore this poll card. Postal voters cannot be given a ballot paper at a polling station.**

- If you have appointed a proxy to vote in person for you, you may still vote, as long as you do so before your proxy has voted on your behalf.
- Your polling station is accessible for disabled voters. Where needed, stations have temporary ramps and all have low level voting booths. Large print ballot papers will be available to help partially sighted voters. Special devices will be available to help blind voters vote in secret.
- A telephone translation service is available in all polling stations.
- Do not leave it until the last minute to vote. NO ballot paper will be issued after 10.00pm, even if you are in the polling station.
