Public inspection of the full Register of Electors

Representation of the People (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002

- 1 The full Register of Electors shows the names of all those registered to vote.
- 2 It is open to public inspection, under staff supervision **only**, at the Electoral Services office, Room 28, Hammersmith Town Hall, King Street, London, W6 9JU (please note the time limits for inspection outlined on page 2).
- 3 Only hand-written notes may be taken. Photocopying or electronic recording are **not** allowed by law.
- 4 Information from the full list may **not** be used for commercial purposes if the elector has “opted out” from the edited Voters List.
- 5 Anyone who fails to observe these conditions is committing a **criminal offence** (maximum fine £5,000).

Register of Electors

Inspection – time limits



Members of the public are entitled to inspect the register of electors.

The purpose is to allow residents to check the accuracy of the register.

Details from the register must **not** be used for any commercial reasons, and therefore it is expected that you will not need to look up more than a small number of addresses at any given time.

Additionally, the law says you may view the register only under staff supervision. We are a small team, and our staff need to be available to help other residents, both in person and on the telephone.

It is for the above reasons that we ask you to limit your inspection of the voters list to no more than 20 minutes per day.
