3] Minutes of meeting 3 March These were agreed to be a true record.

4] 2005-2006 plan

4.1 Car Free Day, 22 September Alex Forrest reported that Godolphin Road had been proposed as it could link with a scheduled event on 17 September at the adjacent community garden. However, after discussion, it was agreed that we should seek to maximise impact and therefore, close King Street even for a short period, say 2 hours maximum during the middle of the day. It was agreed that the Forum should propose this course for either 17 or 22 September to Cllr Cartwright.

4.2. Flora of Fulham Jill Hamilton outlined the programme (see www.floraoffulham.org), hoping that it would provide a template for other communities nationwide. The Urban Studies Centre will be co-ordinating schools participating and an exhibition is planned for Fulham Palace. She sought support from the Forum in identifying potential supporters in the Fulham area and suggestions included the Fulham Society, Hammersmith & Fulham Historic Buildings Group, Residents and Tenants Associations and the London Wildlife Trust. It was agreed that we should assist in every way we can.
