The proposed White City development was excessive, he said, noting the anticipated rise in local vehicle movements by 20,000 car movements each day. He suggested that this would be seen by future generations as an unsustainable figure. He concluded by stating that he felt that the Council could have assisted the work of his committee more and that he would be resigning his role at this meeting.
