







Welcome to the 2025 edition of Summer In H&F

AS SPRING gives way to the long heady days of summer, our river walk and award-winning parks are more important than ever. Whether it's jazz on the lawn, new activities for children and young people or enjoying local nature sanctuaries, we're offering a range of activities to make this summer special.

This year marks the fifteenth since Austerity was introduced. Back then, H&F's budget was more than a third larger than now.

Despite that, my team and I have delivered more and better services for residents. We've been able to do that because we introduced the 'Ruthless Financial Efficiency' programme, saving a record £138m by modernising services and cutting waste. To put that in context, this year's entire budget is £220m.

Because of our ruthless approach to saving, this summer we'll be investing in new measures to:

- Give even more support to the police because we're determined to crackdown on crime and anti-social behaviour
- Improve our public realm with new investment in neighbourhoods and high streets such as Uxbridge Road, King Street, Fulham Broadway and Wandsworth Bridge Road.
- Put new and better recreation facilities in our parks and open spaces.

We're working to make H&F an even better place to live and work. I hope you have a great summer.

OUR "SAVE Charing Cross Hospital" campaign - in which the council and residents stood together – was successful in stopping the previous government from closing our local hospital and selling the land off to property developers.

Last year, the new Health Secretary confirmed that Charing Cross, alongside Hammersmith and St Mary's hospitals, had been reinstated to the New Hospital Programme.

Now, we are working handin-hand with Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust to accelerate the full refurbishment of Charing Cross and Hammersmith hospitals.

We know national budgets are limited so we are looking at how we can develop alternative funding options to fast-track the process.

We have created a partnership between healthcare bosses, academics at Imperial College

London and H&F Council to extend the role of the hospitals as global centres of life science innovation. That will boost the economy and help secure new investment.

Crucially, it will also help release finances to modernise NHS services. It's another example of how H&F is working to ensure that local residents have everimproving services on their doorsteps.





Stay cool with a splash in our parks

We have stepped in to give the Met Police unprecedented support to tackle crime – but there's still more to do

WE'RE RAMPING up our efforts to keep people safe this summer with more people out enjoying our high streets, parks and events.

How we're funding the fight against crime:

£4.5million

for our leading CCTV network

£4.85million

for our one-of-a-kind **Law Enforcement Team**

£1million

for our pioneering Gangs Unit

£250,000

to prevent violence against women and girls

H&F Leader Stephen Cowan says: "We won't tolerate crime or disorder in H&F. We know how tough it is for the Met - so we're delivering unprecedented support. That includes our Law Enforcement Team (LET) officers patrolling in every ward and the best, most sophisticated CCTV network in the country to help fight crime."

Eyes in the sky

We're investing **£4.5million** over four years in a CCTV system monitoring our streets, estates, parks and open spaces. Our 2,500 cameras across H&F help our team spot issues and live stream footage

to Met officers.

Boots on the ground

Camera operators are also connected to our 72-strong team of LET officers, who patrol our streets day and night to keep them safe and clean.

Protecting women and girls

We're the first borough in the country to make street harassment a fineable offence anywhere in the borough. Penalties reach up to £1,000.

Preventing young people falling into crime

We're investing nearly £1million in our pioneering Gangs Unit. Working with the Met, our team helps prevent young people at risk from being exploited by criminals.

We've saved £138million by ruthless financial efficiency and modernising how we work. That's why we can re-invest in unique services you simply wouldn't get anywhere else

WE ARE delivering many unique services that people simply cannot get anywhere else. We do this to make H&F the best borough in which to live, work and socialise in the country.

H&F Deputy Leader Alex Sanderson says: "As a compassionate council we're constantly working to improve the lives of people living in H&F. And we're supported by the selfless work of local people and organisations who go above and beyond to support their communities and neighbours."

Free home care

Since 2015, more than 5,000 older and Disabled people have been supported through our free home care service. It helps them live independently for longer in their own homes. We're still the only council in England to offer this life-changing support.

Cost-of-living support

We know the very high cost of living puts pressure on local families and residents. We're here to help and have handled more than 30,000 calls from local people since January 2024, assisting 7,500 people.

If you're struggling to pay for necessities including food, gas or electricity, you may be eligible to receive up to £900 from our Hardship Prevention Fund. For more information visit: lbhf.gov.uk/costofliving

Support for care leavers

We want to ensure local young people with care experience have the same opportunities and chances in life as their peers.

In 2023, we opened a hub in Shepherds Bush where they can see friends, meet with their social workers, study or even do their laundry. They are also exempt from council tax and have access to dedicated support designed to help them transition into adulthood and settle into their first home.

We were the first borough in London to offer free breakfasts to all primary pupils. Since 2019, we've served more than two million free meals to young learners.

Help for veterans

We pledged extra support for our local veterans. This includes cutting council tax for veterans by 25%, helping members of our

Armed Forces community access affordable housing and adapting homes for wounded soldiers.

We want to help everyone enjoy local theatre. Our Free First Night scheme at Lyric Theatre Hammersmith offers people who live or work in H&F TWO FREE TICKETS to every major show. So far we've given away 60,000+ free tickets.





Our standout schools in H&F





H&F IS one of the best places to live for the top performing schools in the country. All our schools in H&F are currently rated as 'Good' or 'Outstanding' by Ofsted.

Our impressive line-up of excellent schools are led by our teachers and school staff working tirelessly each academic year alongside parents to help our young people reach their potential. We know choosing a primary school is an enormous decision for parents, and that first day at school is a huge moment in every child's life.

If your child was born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, they will be starting reception in primary school from September 2026.

You can start applying for a school place from 1 September 2025 when the applications open. The application process closes on 15 January 2026, and the national offer day is 16 April 2026. Applications for secondary school places will open this year on 1 September and close on 31 October.

We pioneered free breakfasts for all primary school children

WE OFFER free breakfast daily to pupils at 30 local primary schools and two nurseries. That's because we want every child to start the day with a full stomach.

We were the first borough in London to offer free breakfasts to all primary pupils, as we believe that no child should ever be too hungry to learn. Since we started offering free breakfasts in 2019, we've served

more than two million meals to young learners.

Our work doesn't stop when school is out. Last year, we offered families in need more than 5,000 holiday food packs for children who might otherwise miss the breakfast they normally eat at school.

Got a young tree in your neighbourhood? In hot weather they need our help. Please water it so it stays alive and healthy.

- 1 Water regularly trees need approximately 10 litres a week during summer
- Morning or evening water during cooler parts of the day to prevent evaporation
- Use rainwater keep your tree happy and water bills low
- 4 Be consistent even a little water goes a long way for young trees.

Hammersmith Park

Sitting between Shepherds Bush and White City, this park is not far from Loftus Road stadium and the Westfield shopping centre. Recently we've revamped the basketball and tennis courts to make them ready for summer.

London's **first-ever Tiny Forest** was planted in the park in 2021. Made up of **600 native trees**, it's working to boost biodiversity, support local wildlife and clean our air.

The park's unique historic

Japanese garden – called the

Garden of Peace – was unveiled
in 1910 to celebrate links between
England and Japan. It's the oldest
publicly owned Japanese garden
in the UK.

HAMMERSMIT

Furnivall Gardens

This riverside park is the perfect spot to watch **local wildlife** and for **water sports** fans to enjoy the Thames.

In the east corner of the park you can find **The Berlin Lamp**, a West Berlin streetlamp gifted to H&F by Willy Brandt, the Mayor of Berlin, in 1963. It celebrates our twinning with Neukölln, one of the 12 boroughs in Germany's capital.

Brook Green

Brook Green, Hammersmith, is known for its unusual shape but did you also know that most of the park's trees are between **80 and 140 years old**?

As well as the ancient trees, the park is home to a dog park, café, three floodlit tennis courts, two mini tennis courts, and a recently refurbished children's play area

We're creating cleaner, greener and safer streets

Healthy school runs, cleaner energy and more green spaces are all helping to cut the deadly toxins in the air we breathe



HAMMERSMITH & FULHAM is

the tenth worst area in England for air pollution. Children are particularly sensitive as their bodies and lungs develop.

Here's how we're working with schools and residents to change this for the better:

School Streets Plus

Our new School Streets Plus trials are creating cleaner and safer ways for families to get their kids to school. The trials are located at the following primary schools across H&F - Wendell Park, Sir John Lillie and Holy Cross Catholic.

Managing the traffic flow during school drop-offs and pick-ups helps protect pupils from toxic emissions, and makes walking and cycling easier and safer too.

These School Streets Plus schemes are accompanied by a wave of improvements to local streets, including new wider pavements, more bike parking and more green planting to help filter the air.



£2million Green InvestmentH&F is the **first council** in the
UK to raise £2million for vital
environmental improvements.

These funds from investors are going towards projects including **new rain gardens** that help protect homes from flooding and create cool spaces for the summer. You can watch these rain gardens bloom in King Street, Hammersmith; Purcell Crescent, Fulham; and Edith Road, West Kensington.

Meanwhile, residents can soon invest in our **community solar scheme** at Jack Tizard School. Earn approximately 3% in interest and help the White City school save on their energy bills.

Let the sun pay for your energy You can soon install bigger and better solar panels to run your home on sunshine.

Place these items in your household recycling:



Mixed paper & card

Card, cardboard, paper (clean and dry; but no glitter please!)



■ Mixed glass bottles & jars

Glass bottles, jars (with lids placed loose in recycling)



Cartons

Cartons, Tetra Paks (squash and keep plastic lids on)



Plastic packing containers

Plastic bottles, tubs, trays, pots (squashed and lids placed back on)



■ Food tins & drink cans

Aluminium and steel tins and cans (clean and empty)

Top recycling tips

- Flatten cardboard boxes
- Rinse out bottles, jars and cartons
- Squash and keep the lids on bottles and cartons

Please don't put these items in your recycling:



Black sacks

Black sacks should be used for general household waste only. Place in your black bin

THAMES VALLEY Harriers is London's premier athletics club. based in Wormwood Scrubs.


It has counted multiple Team GB Olympians among its number. It is also the go-to place for any adults or youngsters wanting to get involved in track or field athletics.


