What? and Why?

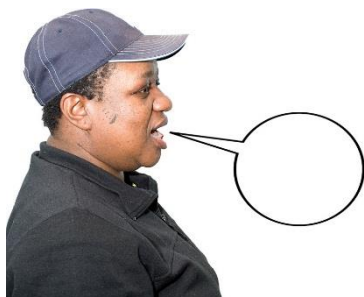

The Disabled People's Commission will run for 15 months. It will try to make a change in EVERY PART of the council's work.



The point of having this is to make life easier for disabled residents of Hammersmith & Fulham.



"Nothing About Us Without Us" – this means disabled people make decisions about their services and future.



The commission will be made up of disabled people from the borough, who will bring their ideas and experiences.



The commission will try out ideas on new projects – making sure the new projects involve disabled people properly.

Aims



The commission aims to make Hammersmith & Fulham the most inclusive and accessible borough in London.



It aims to make sure that the council always include disabled people in any decision about their services.

Stage 1



Look at the experiences of disabled people across London and other places too.



This is to see what works well and does not work so well.

Stage 2



Look at the experiences of disabled people in Hammersmith & Fulham.



This is about quality of life in the borough. The commission also want to find out if the council have been involving disabled people in important decisions.

Stage 3



Public events will be held to tell people in Hammersmith & Fulham what the commission has found.



This is also a chance to help the commission decide what to do next.

Stage 4



The commission will write a final report and feed it back to central government, council and the public.
