✓ Please put all these in your recycling sack or smart bank:



✓ Paper, card and cardboard



✓ Cans and tins



✓ Plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays (no lids)



✓ Glass bottles and jars (no lids)



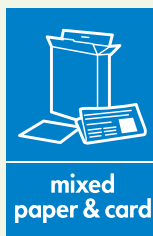
✓ Cartons

Please ensure all items are clean and dry

Don't put a lid on it!

Please remember to remove all lids from tins, cartons and bottles, and put them in your rubbish bin. We can't recycle those.

Top Christmas recycling tips



mixed paper & card

Recycle Christmas cards and wrapping paper (not metallic wrapping paper) in your clear sack or smart bank.



small appliances

Recycle small electrical items, such as mobile phones and hair dryers, by organising a free collection from Traid. To book, call 020 8733 2595, or visit our website.



mixed textiles & clothes

Traid also offers a free collection for clothing and textiles. Call 020 8733 2595 to book. Alternatively, you can find your nearest textile recycling bank at www.recyclenow.com



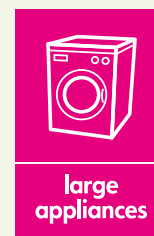
batteries

food waste

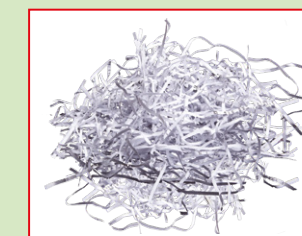

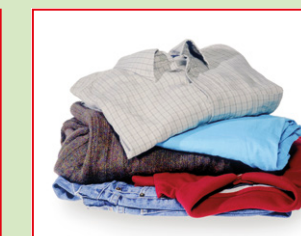
large appliances

Need a bulky waste collection? For large items, like furniture or appliances, call 020 8753 1100 to book a bulky waste collection. We'll collect up to ten items for £25.65.

Aerosols? No can do

For safety reasons, we're no longer recycling aerosol cans. If you've got cans to dispose of, please now put them in your general waste.

REAL TREES ONLY

Free Christmas tree recycling collection

If you normally get an on-street rubbish collection, simply leave your tree where you'd leave your rubbish.

Please make sure:

- it is clearly visible
- it is not obstructing the pavement
- all decorations and pots are removed.

Please put your tree out for collection before 7am on your collection day (check the front page of this leaflet) between Wednesday 2 and Tuesday 15 January.

Trees will be collected in the afternoon.
