H&F Hive offers £100,000 funding for community projects

H&F Hive is open to communities wanting to raise funds for local events, make improvements to their environment or set up new services. As well as raising funds from local people or organisations, people can now bid for small grants from the council.

National Youth Agency's Environment Now funds £100k of young people's green tech ideas

Deadline is Tuesday 14 November 2017

Young people from 17 to 24 years old can get funding up to £10,000 to create their digital ideas to help the environment, such as improving energy efficiency, reducing waste, or recycling. Successful applicants will get support from The Environment Now team, their own professional mentor and other sustainability partners and industry professionals.

BBC Children in Need - Main Grants Programme

Deadline for applications is 16 January 2018 (midnight)

Main Grants programme is open to charities and not-for-profit organisations applying for grants over £10,000 per year for up to three years.

O2 Think Big Youth Programme

The programme supports young people in the UK (aged between 13 and 25) who want to use digital technology to make positive changes to their communities. Initially funding of £300 is available to get projects off the ground. Successful projects may be able to apply for the second level of the programme and which provides funding of up to £2,500.

The Henry Plumb Foundation

The Henry Plumb Foundation funds young people (18-35) with interests, business ideas, study plans that will lead to a career in the agricultural or food industry. Funding ranges from £500 - £3,000.

Shackleton Foundation

They provide up to £10,000 of seed funding and support to enable aspiring leaders and social entrepreneurs to establish their own ventures to help young people in challenging circumstances.
