



**Hartopp and Lannoy Points:
Fire Safety Fact Sheet**

We have worked with the London Fire Brigade and leading fire safety experts to put in place the Fire Safety Measures to keep Hartopp and Lannoy residents safe

1. Simultaneous evacuation

In the event of a fire, instead of 'stay put', evacuate immediately when you hear the communal fire alarm.



2. **Fire Wardens** are on site 24/7 and work to the National Fire Chief Council's standard for 'Waking Watch'. There is a dedicated fire liaison officer.



3. The installation of the communal **fire alarm systems** is complete. In the event of a fire calls are routed without delay to LFB. This is backed up by a **999** call by the Fire Wardens. Additional smoke and heat detectors are being installed into flats in every room.



4. The production of a detailed **Emergency Plan** and an updated Fire Risk Assessment have been completed. These take account of the alarm installation and how that changes our emergency procedures. The Fire Risk Assessment can be viewed at www.lbhf.gov.uk/fireriskassessments

5. A secure **Premises Information Box**

containing the location of residents with vulnerabilities is located in the Ground Floor lobby. In the event of a fire, the wardens will provide it to the Fire Brigade Commander and any information about the location of residents.



6. **Evacuation chairs**

are on site, and installed in each block where mobility issues are known. Fire Wardens are trained in the use of the chairs.



7. A programme for

fire safety works to communal areas has started on site to address issues shown in the Fire Risk Assessment.

How can residents help?

You must not bring gas or oxygen cylinders into the buildings.
