SEXUAL HEALTH FACTSHEET







Sexual Health is a key Public Health issue, affecting individual's physical and mental wellbeing. This factsheet highlights some of the key indicators of the sexual health in the borough of Hammersmith and Fulham, including STI screening and HIV status, use of contraception and teenage pregnancy.



STI Screening Demographics

Ethnicity: The group with the highest uptake of STI screening is White British (44%) and Other White (26%).



Gender: More women use STI screening services than men. Most recent data show users are 58% female, 41% male and 1% other.


