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Help with completing your application for a scrap metal collector's licence

Section 1

This section asks for details of the applicant and the trading name of the business.

You are asked to submit a Basic Disclosure Certificate. The forms to submit a subject access search can be downloaded from the <u>Metropolitan Police website</u> or alternatively an online application can be made via the <u>DBS website</u>.

This is because the Home Office has decided that you need to tell the council if you have been convicted of certain crimes. Possessing a conviction may not automatically prevent you from having a licence if the offence was unrelated to being a scrap metal dealer or a long time ago, and you can convince the council that you are a suitable person.

A Basic Disclosure Certificate is considered to be only valid for a limited time, but can be used to apply to as many councils as you want within that time. Typically, three months is the longest that you can expect your check to be considered valid.

Individual applicants are also asked to submit two recent colour photographs. These should be passport size (45 millimetres by 35 millimetres), taken against a light background and with your features clearly distinguishable (no sunglasses or head coverings unless you wear a head covering due to religious beliefs).

A **collector's licence** allows you to travel within the council area to collect scrap metal. However, if you also have an office, base or a yard to store vehicles etc., you may need to obtain a **site licence**. Also if you wish to buy and sell scrap metal from a fixed location within the council area please apply for a **site licence** on the relevant application form.

You may only apply for one type of licence in each council area, but you can apply to run multiple sites. For instance, you could apply to run 3 sites in council A's area, and also apply to be a collector in council B's area.

Section 2

In order to carry on your business you may need to hold other environmental permits or licences that we should know about. For instance, if you carry waste as part of your business it is a legal requirement to register as a waste carrier. This includes transporting waste while travelling from job to job, to a storage place for disposal later, or to a waste disposal company or waste site. This section also asks for details of any other scrap metal licences you hold. Please make sure you include the licence number so that we can check this against the national register.

We also want to know if you operate or propose to operate a site in another local authority area, along with details of this site, the council which has licensed it or to whom you have applied for a licence, or whether any previous applications or licences have been refused or revoked.

Section 3 – Motor salvage operator

This section asks if you will be salvaging motor vehicles as part of your work. The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 brings together the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964 together with Part 1 of the Vehicles (Crime) Act 2001, which means you now only need a scrap metal dealer's licence.

Section 4 – Bank accounts that will be used for payments to suppliers

This section asks you for the bank details which you will use to pay people for the scrap metal you receive or sell. This is to check that you are not selling the metal for cash, which is illegal. These details will be kept securely by the council.

Section 5 - Payment

There is a fee to apply for a licence.. The fee varies from council to council as it reflects their costs of processing the form and checking that people are doing what the licence requires. Licences cannot be granted unless the correct fee has been paid.

Section 6 - Criminal convictions

This section asks you to set out any relevant convictions or enforcement activity that has been undertaken against you by the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales. It is an offence under the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 to make or recklessly make a false statement. The information listed here will be checked against the Basic Disclosure Certificate that you are asked to submit with the application, along with information retained by the police and the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales.

Section 8 - Declaration

You need to sign the form for it to be accepted. This section also explains that the council has to share some of your details with the police, Environment Agency, or Natural Resources Wales when checking you are a suitable person to hold a licence. If you do not agree to this use of your information then you should **not** sign the form. If you are in any doubt about what this section means then speak to the Council's licensing team.
